Sir:
On Sunday, October 5, 2008 at approximately 2050 hours, I received a radio call from Car 465/Off. Delaney who requested I respond to 11 Irving Street where he had been dispatched to on a call of an unresponsive person.

On arrival, Off. Delaney advised me that a 44 year old male by the name of Bernard McNicholas had been transported to Mt. Auburn Hospital by Watertown Fire Rescue after being found not breathing and not having a pulse. He further advised me that a roommate of the victims, Mr. Roy Butler had been the one who found Mr. McNicholas and that Mr. Roy Butler had since left the area to go to the Fraternal Order of Eagles, 44 Mt. Auburn Street..

Upon checking with the Mt. Auburn Hospital Emergency Room, we were informed that McNicholas had been pronounced dead.

Due to Mr. McNicholas' young age and past drug history, I contacted Lt. Logue about having the Watertown P.D. Detective Division notified and respond. Det. Collins was contacted by Lt. Logue and responded to the scene. State Police CPAC (Trooper Kevin Baker) was also notified and responded.

Det. Collins went to Mt. Auburn Hospital to view and photograph McNicholas' body. Mt. Auburn Hospital Emergency Room personnel had contacted the Medical Examiners Office who took jurisdiction of Mr. McNicholas' body.

I had Off. Delaney and Off. R. Munger respond to the Fraternal Order Of Eagles, 44 Mt. Auburn Street to speak with possible witnesses about McNicholas's activities. I then directed Off. O'Hearn to remain at 11 Irving Street to maintain the integrity of the scene and I supplied him with crime scene sign-in sheets to track any law enforcement personnel that may enter. I then responded to the Fraternal Order of Eagles assist Off. Delaney and Off. R. Munger.

On arrival at the Eagles I found Off. Delaney speaking with Roy Butler, who was relating the evenings events. Off. Delaney advised me he had already interviewed the Eagles Bartender Mr. Christopher Plocharczyk as well as off duty bartender Mr. Paul Donnelly and bar patron Mr. Thomas Eaves.

See Off. Delaney's report for all names, addresses, phone numbers and interview statements.

While at the Fraternal Order of Eagles I did not detect any odor of alcohol emanating from the bartender Mr. Plocharczyk. I did smell alcohol on the off duty bartender Mr. Donnelly, as well as Mr. Butler and Mr. Eaves, it did not appear they were intoxicated.

Sir,

While assigned to route 5, Ofc. Brendan O'Hearn and I were dispatched to 11 Irving St. for an unresponsive male. Upon arrival we located a white male, later identified as Bernard James McNicholas, lying on the floor of his bedroom in a prone position. There was clear liquid coming from his mouth. There was no trauma or open wounds observed. I was unable to get a pulse, nor did I observe any signs of breathing. Ofc. O'Hearn applied the AED patches. Oxygen was applied. The AED did not advise a shock. CPR was started. The Watertown Fire Rescue, along with Para medics arrived on scene.

MCNICHOLAS was transported to the Mt. Auburn Hospital via Watertown Fire Rescue. He was pronounced at this time. See Det. David Collins report for specific information.

Ofc. Richard Munger arrived on scene.

On scene was a friend and roommate who was identified as Roy Butler. BUTLER related the following. He saw MCNICHOLAS around 0900hrs just prior to him going to the zoo with his family. The next time BUTLER saw MCNICHOLAS was between 1630 and 1700hrs at the Fraternal Order of Eagles located at 44 Mt. Auburn St. MCNICHOLAS walked in and seemed fine. He went to the corner of the bar and sat next to John Elacqua. Within 5 to 10 minutes MCNICHOLAS was out of it.

Two patrons at the bar drove MCNICHOLAS home. BUTLER identified these individuals as David Cahill and Thomas Eaves. EAVES called BUTLER while they were at 11 Irving St. because they could not get in the locked apartment. BUTLER arrived and let them into the apartment. He also assisted them carrying MCNICHOLAS into the bedroom. They laid him on the floor. BUTLER states that MCNICHOLAS was still breathing when they all left. BUTLER went to his girlfriend's house, Laura Barbato, for approximately 1 to 2 hours.

BUTLER then went back to 11 Irving St. to check on MCNICHOLAS. He found MCNICHOLAS in the same spot they left him, but he was not breathing. BUTLER then called the bartender at the "EAGLES" bar, Paul Donnelly. Donnelly then called 911.

BUTLER stated that MCNICHOLAS was taking more than 80mg of oxycontin a day, but supposedly stopped 4 months ago. BUTLER strongly believes that he had taken something probably Oxycontin.

The landlord, Christina McAuliffe was in the residence upon arrival and started to clean up the kitchen area. She was asked to go up to her place on the second floor. BUTLER went upstairs with MCAULIFFE.

Sgt. Jeffrey Pugliese arrived on scene.

Ofc. O'Hearn stayed at 11 Irving St., while Sgt. Pugliese, Ofc. Munger and I went to the Fraternal Order of Eagles bar. At this location, I was able to speak to the following individuals Paul Donnelly, Christopher Plocharczyk and Thomas Eaves.

DONNELLY stated that he first saw MCNICHOLAS around 1400hrs when he walked into the "EAGLES". DONNELLY was the bartender at the time and served MCNICHOLAS 3 or 4 beers. MCNICHOLAS left around 1530hrs. MCNICHOLAS came back to the "EAGLES" around 1730hrs and appeared fine. A short time later, DONNELLY was informed by the current bartender, Christopher Plocharczyk, that MCNICHOLAS was "fucked up". DONNELLY told MCNICHOLAS that he was going to call 911, but he refused saying he would be fine. He just wanted to be driven home. EAVES and CAHILL drove him home. DONNELLY stated that he later received a call from BUTLER saying he thought MCNICHOLAS was dead. DONNELLY then called 911.

PLOCHARCZYK started work at 1700hrs today. The first time he saw MCNICHOLAS was around 1715 to 1730hrs. MCNICHOLAS came in fine and sat down next to ELACQUA and ordered a Bud Light beer. He had a couple of sips. After 5 to 10 minutes, PLOCHARCZYK noticed that something was wrong with MCNICHOLAS. PLOCHARCZYK knew that MCNICHOLAS was a diabetic and offered him orange juice, but he refused. MCNICHOLAS was driven home.

PLOCHARCZYK stated that he knows that MCNICHOLAS has been abusing Oxycontin and had recently been put on a Fentanyl patch.

EAVES said that he first saw MCNICHOLAS at 11 Irving St. around 1430hrs and he was fine. He was not sure if he had been drinking any alcohol prior to that. The next time EAVES saw MCNICHOLAS was after the Patriots game started at the "EAGLES". MCNICHOLAS sat next to ELACQUA and within 5 minutes his eyes started to close. MCNICHOLAS refused to have DONNELLY call 911 so CAHILL and EAVES brought him home.

At the residence, EAVES asked MCNICHOLAS if he wanted them to call 911. He refused. They brought MCNICHOLAS to his bedroom and laid him on the floor. EAVES described MCNICHOLAS breathing similar to snoring.

All Officers left the "EAGLES" and went back to 11 Irving St. I transported BUTLER back to the residence from the "EAGLES".

Det. David Collins and Trooper Kevin Baker were now on scene. Det. Collins received consent from BUTLER to search and photograph the apartment. See Det. Collins report for more information.

There were several items seized from the apartment to keep for safe keeping. These items include prescription medication, jewelry, a check book and bank savings book. A property control form was completed. These items were placed on the floor of the property room.

Ofc. O'Hearn completed an incident sign-in log that is attached to this report.

Sir,

In reference to an initial investigation by Officer Delaney regarding a sudden death at 11 Irving Street, the following is submitted.

I was requested to respond and assist Patrol Officers at 11 Irving Street and upon my arrival I was briefed by Sergeant Pugilese. I learned that Bernard "Jimmy" McNicholas, a 44 year old male, was found on his bedroom floor unresponsive by Roy Butler, a roommate. Mr. McNicholas was taken to Mt. Auburn Hospital by Watertown Fire Rescue in cardiac arrest. I further learned that this victim was taken home earlier in the evening from the Eagles Club & Bar because he had symptoms of being under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

Note: Roy Butler told Officer Delaney that Mr. McNicholas struggled with an addiction to oxycontin.

We did not know the current condition Bernard "Jimmy" McNicholas so Sergeant Pugilese assigned me to the hospital to obtain an update. Upon my arrival at the hospital, I learned that Mr. McNicholas was pronounced dead by Dr. Easter. I spoke with Dr. Easter who said that Mr. McNicholas came into the hospital in full cardiac arrest and after several attempts; they were unable to revive him. He said that he did not see any obvious signs of external trauma on Mr. McNicholas' body. I photographed Mr. McNicholas' body at the hospital.

I responded back to 11 Irving Street and assisted patrol in processing the scene. We found several prescription pill bottles in the name of Mr. McNicholas most of which indicate side effects of drowsiness and not to take with alcohol. I following is a list of prescription medications found at the scene, all issued by Dr. Cancian;

1. Lopazepam 1mg tablet, 30 pills issued 8/20/08 for anxiety 0 left
2. Metformin 850 mg tablet, 60 pills issued 8/20/08, 5 left
3. Cymbalta 60mg capsules, 60 pills issued 9/15/08, 35 left
4. Gabapentin 300 mg capsules, 90 pills issued 9/15/08, 53 left
5. Actos 15 mg tablets, 30 tablets issued 8/13/08, 4 left
6. Zyprexa 2.5 mg tablets, 60 issued 9/17/08, 51 left
7. Fentanyl 50 mcg/h patch, 10 issued 9/19/08, 0 left

- We also took custody (for safe keeping) of the following items;

1. Wallet with personal papers, cards
2. Jewelry, four rings, 1 pin
3. Bank of America check book
4. Watertown Savings bank book

- These items were turned over to Christine McNicholas, the wife of Bernard.

On October 7, 2008 I attended the Autopsy of Bernard "Jimmy" McNicholas, conducted by Dr Springer. She located a Fentanyl patch on the right forearm of Mr. McNicholas. We observed the following injuries on Mr. McNicholas; a scratch on the left side forehead, scratches on his left forearm, left knee and bruising on his left upper arm. Dr. Springer found no obvious signs of trauma that would have contributed to this death. She took samples for toxicology analysis to evaluate what drugs or other substances were in his system. Dr. Springer did not have an official cause of death at this time, pending toxicology reports.

On October 10, 2008, Sergeant Unsworth and I met with Chris Plocharczyk, the nighttime bartender at the Eagle's on the day of this incident. Chris said that he started work at 1700 hours and spoke with the day bartender, Paul Donnelly and got an update. He said that Jay Guild, Bernard "Jimmy" McNicholas and Roy Butler came in together around 5:15 pm. Chris said that Jimmy sat down next to John Elacqua and bought a beer for him. Chris said that he heard Jimmy apologizing to John about something and it appeared they were making up for something. Chris said that John Elacqua purchased the last three squares for the bar pool, Derek Doucette won the pool and bought beers for everyone. He said that when he walked back from the other side of the bar he noticed that Jimmy was "going in and out of it". Chris said that he thought Jimmy was having trouble with his diabetes and gave him a glass of orange juice. Chris said that he asked him, "do you want me to call 911" and Jimmy told him "no I'm fine". Chris said that the three trustees (Paul Donnelly, Dave Cahill and Derek Doucette) had just come back from picking up Chinese food and he told Paul Donnelly that Jimmy was "fucked up". Chris said that Paul Donnelly walked over to Jimmy and told him you have to go home. Chris said that Paul Donnelly, Tom Eaves and Dave Cahill walked Jimmy out and Dave & Tom drove him home around 5:40 pm. Chris said that he had never seen Jimmy that "fucked up" before and had heard that Jay Guild saw Jimmy eat a Fentanyl patch earlier in the day.

Note: Fentanyl 50 mcg/h patch is a 72 hour time released drug for the control of pain. From WEBMD - this medication is a strong narcotic pain reliever. It should only be used for patients who have been using moderate-to-large amounts of a powerful narcotic medication (e.g., morphine) regularly. I found this warning on this web page- Do not cut or damage the patch.

Broken, cut, or damaged patches may release large (possibly life-threatening) amounts of medication into your body or into anyone handling the cut/damaged patch.

On October 10, 2008, Sergeant Unsworth and I met with John Elacqua at the police station. John said that on the day of Jimmy's death he learned that Jimmy went apple picking with his wife Christine and their son. He said that while sitting at the Eagles bar Jimmy walked in with Roy Butler around 5:15 pm and Jimmy walked over to him and was crying. He said that they had a falling out and had not spoken with each other in about four months. After a short conversation, John said Jimmy's health was declining. He thought it was his diabetes and got him orange juice, but this did not help. He was yelling to everyone in the bar to call 911 and no one did. He said Paul Donnelly walked Jimmy out and Dave Cahill and Tom Eaves drove him home. He said that the reason no one called the police is because of all the drug dealing going on inside the bar, no one wanted the police to come. John said, "I have never seen anyone that high". I asked John why he did not call 911 and he said "I was outnumbered no one wanted to call 911". I asked John, did you see anyone give Jimmy drugs and he said, no. I asked John if he had given Jimmy any drugs and he said, no. John said that Roy Butler came in the bar after finding Jimmy unconscious and confronted him about drugs. John said, "Roy asked me if I gave Jimmy any drugs while at the bar and I said no". They got into a shoving match and Paul Donnelly asked John to leave the bar. John said that he arrived home in Sudbury around 7 pm.

On October 15, 2008, Sergeant Unsworth and I met with Christine McNicholas at the Police Station. Christine said she, Jimmy and their son went apple picking earlier in the day. She said that Jimmy seemed fine all day. We spoke with her about Jimmy's diabetes and Christine said that he was not taking care of himself properly, saying, he had two ice creams and fudge during the day. She said that she dropped Jimmy off at the Eagles around 1:30 pm and that is the last time she spoke with him.

On October 16, 2008, Paul Donnelly came into the station and spoke with us regarding this incident. Paul said that on the day of Jimmy's death he was working the bar and Jimmy came in around 1:30 pm, had three or four beers and left with Jay Guild. Paul said that around 5:30 pm, as he was leaving to pick-up Chinese food at Tiki Inn, Jimmy, Roy and Jay came into the bar. Paul said that when he returned to the bar Chris said to him that Jimmy was "fucked up". Paul said that he walked over to Jimmy and told him that he had to leave. Paul said that Jimmy pushed him away, saying "I'm fine". Paul said he told Jimmy that he was going to call 911 and Jimmy said, "no, no, I'm fine". Paul said that Jimmy got up from the chair and they walked him outside. Paul said that Jimmy was holding onto the doorway as he exited the bar. Paul told us that Jay Guild saw Jimmy eat a Fentanyl patch earlier in the day. Paul said that Roy told him that Jay and Jimmy purchased an 18 pack of beer during the afternoon and only had four beers left. Paul said that he received a phone call from Roy Butler saying, Jimmy was not

breathing and I told him to call 911. Paul said that he called 911 sending help to 11 Irving Street. Sergeant Unsworth asked Mr. Donnelly if he was drinking alcohol while bartending on this day? Mr. Donnelly said 'yes a couple of beers'.

On October 17, 2008 Sergeant Unsworth and I went to the Eagles Bar to speak with Dave Cahill. Dave said that he arrived at the bar on the day of Jimmy's death at 5:30 pm. Paul had asked me to help get Jimmy home and I drove him to Irving Street. I asked him why he did not call 911 and he said I thought that Jimmy had too many beers. Dave said that when he arrived at Jimmy's house, Roy Butler was with him when he left. I asked him about drug dealing going on inside the bar and he said, 'that's not my bag'. I told him that he if he was going to be the bar manager, he would need to get more involved in what is going on.

While we were at the bar we learned from Jim Fahey, the secretary of the Eagles, that Jimmy McNicholas is still the manager of record for the Eagles. He said that the ABCC has not ruled on Dave Cahill appointment and it is pending on Dave Cahill getting TIP certified.

On October 29, 2008, Sergeant Unsworth and I met with Jay Guild in Waltham. Jay Guild said that he was at the Eagles in the afternoon watching the games and drinking. He said that he left the Eagles with Jimmy and they picked up an eighteen pack of beer and went to Jimmy's apartment. He said they drank the beers (only two left) and as they were getting ready to go back to the Eagles, Jay watched Jimmy cut open a Fentanyl patch with a pair of scissors and suck the liquid from the patch. He said they then went back to the Eagles. Jay said that Jimmy had about 12 - 14 beers during the afternoon.

During this investigation we found NO indication or evidence that Bernard James McNicholas had ingested anything that was a contributing factor to his death, without his knowledge. Most of the prescription medications we found in Jimmy's apartment indicated a caution about drinking alcohol. The information provided by his wife that Jimmy was not taking care of his diabetes was obvious by his consumption of ice cream, fudge and beer on this day. The bartender, Chris Plocharczyk and John Elacqua suspected Jimmy's declining health to be attributed to his diabetes, by supplying him with orange juice, indicates they believed this could have been a medical condition. I believe that in this situation, the Eagles management, who were all present and the bartender, had at the minimum, a responsibility to call for emergency help to deal with Mr. McNicholas' declining health.

On October 31, 2008, I spoke with a staff member at the Medical Examiners Office who stated that the toxicology report is still pending. I respectfully request Sergeant Unsworth and the Licensing Board review this report for further action regarding the management of the Eagles and the current license, which is in the name of Mr. McNicholas.
